
What is AntiqueWeek's Guide to Antique Shops & Malls?

Discover Art Deco elegance in everyday objects

The appeal of modernism shows no signs of waning. Yet, the focus of collectors is evolving. Where mid-century design once reigned supreme, there is growing enthusiasm for the wider array of modernist styles. Notably, the sophisticated charm of Art Deco and the sleek lines of Streamline Moderne are attracting a fresh wave of collectors.

For those new to the world of Art Deco, its origins trace back to France around 1910. The style gained prominence after being showcased at the 1925 International Exhibition of Modern Decorative and Industrial Arts (Exposition Internationale des Arts Décoratifs et Industriels Modernes) in Paris. The style celebrated modernity, social progress, and the allure of machine-made creations, while simultaneously embodying the glamor and opulence of its time.

Art Deco blended perfectly into the "Roaring Twenties," capturing the

extravagant essence of flapper culture and the Jazz Age. As it barreled into the 1930s, designers pivoted to meet economic challenges with practical, yet still elegant, designs. By the early 1940s, Art Deco evolved again, as designers adopted sleek streamlined motifs.

The Art Deco movement is most celebrated for its transformative effect on architecture in the 1920s and 1930s. Its distinctive flair can be seen in the era's majestic skyscrapers built in cities like Chicago and Detroit, as well as in more approachable forms, like the charming hotels that grace Miami's South Beach. Yet, the impact went well beyond architecture, transforming everyday items into works of art. From furniture and glassware to kitchen appliances, each was reinterpreted with the movement's hallmark clean lines and streamlined forms.

The style often featured bold vertical elements juxtaposed against more understated horizontal lines. Both symmetry and deliberate asymmetry were employed. Motifs included repetitive geometric patterns such as triangles, trapezoids, and zigzags, alongside elegant concentric arches and smooth, rounded edges. Designers occasionally incorporated representational elements like animals and sunbursts, while also drawing inspiration from exotic lands, especially those of ancient Egypt. These elements added a touch of opulence and intrigue, capturing the era's fascination with ancient cultures and symbolism.


Although Art Deco designers occasionally used natural materials like animal skin, exotic wood, and jewels or semiprecious stone, their primary focus was on innovative manmade materials that highlighted industrial progress. Materials like Bakelite, vibrant colored glass, and stainless steel became staples, satisfying peoples' fascination with technological advancements.

As the Great Depression set in, the exuberance of early Art Deco gave way to

a more pragmatic approach. Designers migrated toward austerity, often replacing costly materials like silver with chrome and elegant stone with stylized plastic, adapting to the economic realities of the time. By the 1940s, Streamline Moderne emerged, characterized by its sleek polished surfaces and allusion to speed and motion. This style variant embraced a futuristic vision, drawing inspiration from aerodynamic shapes and the sleek sophistication of modern trains and ocean liners.

While collectors can easily find Art Deco in art, sculpture, and jewelry, its reach into industrial design is particularly intriguing. Consumers of that era sought products that symbolized progress and




marked a break from the past. Retailers obliged, with catalogs and displays rife with furniture and household goods that idealized modernity. Designers like Coco Chanel and Erté gained notoriety, while companies like Sunbeam and Zenith made everything from bicycles to coffee makers embodying the era's innovative spirit. That left a treasure trove of Art Deco pieces for today's enthusiasts. Here is a glimpse into the variety:

Automotive Accents: With cars booming in the 1920s and 1930s, design took center stage. Streamlined forms signified speed and style, and Art Deco elements showed up in body trim, hood ornaments, and interior details.

Barware: The early 20th century embodied sophisticated social life often tied to the rise of cocktail culture and Hollywood's portrayal of the flapper lifestyle. Prohibition initially stifled the cocktail scene, but its repeal spurred a resurgence in drinking and entertaining. Factories obliged, producing merchandise like cocktail shakers, traveling bars, and tables with brass rails. Major glass companies like Cambridge and Heisey created striking cocktail sets in cobalt blue and ruby red. Accessories such as garish cigarette holders also became trendy.



Odd Options

Some car options, like air conditioning and automatic transmission, make perfect sense, but others have been downright strange. 
Radioactive Roadster

The Ford Nucleon was a concept car created by Ford in 1957, imagined as a futuristic nuclear-powered vehicle. It was one of several designs from the 1950s and 1960s that explored this idea. Rather than relying on an internal combustion engine, the Nucleon was designed to be powered by a small nuclear reactor located at the rear, using a steam engine driven by uranium fission, much like those on nuclear submarines. The concept was based on the belief that nuclear reactors would eventually become small and safe enough for consumer vehicles.

Divided States

Dealers traveled from afar to set up at Indy Advertising Show

INDIANAPOLIS — The third weekend in September again saw the gates open on the fall Indy Advertising Show at the Boone County Fairgrounds northwest of Indianapolis.

Dealers from as far away as Texas and California traveled to the event, filling all available buildings of the fairgrounds.

The show was hosted by promoters Damon and Angela Granger, who also host a similar spring event at the Indianapolis Fairgrounds.

"We're jam-packed full, using all buildings on the fairgrounds," said Damon Granger, who noted there was an additional breweriana and bottle collectors event added to this year's line-up.

California dealer Carl Lepiane traveled seven days from LaQuinta with a whole van full of goodies, taking time to "shop along the way." Many admired his trio of 1930s country store Watta Pop plaster countertop candy sucker head figures priced from \$400 to \$600 each. Still others "ooohed and aahed" over a colorful screen-printed 18-inch self-framed 1920s Fatima Cigarettes tin tray that could hang at your home for \$1,400.

It was a bit shorter drive for Terry Mcpherson who traveled 900 miles from Arlington, Texas, to set up for the fifth year at the show. Serious gas and oil memorabilia collectors stopped to admire his mid-1950s Around the World brand gasoline pump advertising glass globe — with a price tag of \$30,000 – and yet another tag marked "sold."


Another Texas dealer, Bart Stevens of Irving, showed off a large group of car racing and other sports collectibles. Twenty-one pennants priced from \$150 to \$6,500 each filled the booth, along with a 14-by x 22-inch 1960s Santa Fe Speedway Chicago-area framed cardboard poster for \$250.

Still another long-distance team, Dave and Allie Smith, showed goodies they brought from Bartlesville, Okla. Foot traffic stopped at their booth to check out an early 1900s furry 27-inch-long standing full figure cow that Allie called a "point of purchase piece." The clockwork mechanism milker's head would move up and down to attract shoppers' attention — and could entertain for you at home for \$1,750. People who like smaller items checked out their 9- inch-long pre-1900s Victorian style porcelain and cobalt glass straw drink dispenser, priced at \$850.


Not everyone traveled long distances to the show. Alfred Baker drove just 15 minutes from nearby Zionsville, Ind., to show off a colorful 3 by 5 foot cotton cloth RCA "Nipper Dog" advertising banner that he purchased at an antique market in London, England. He tagged it at \$400. Bottle collectors hovered around his display of 15 cast metal advertising wall-mounted bottle openers offered at \$40 each.

Many folks stopped to gawk at the 42-inch wingspan papier-mâché eagle perched on top of the figure of a globe advertising Majestic Radios.



Books: The early 20th century witnessed a remarkable evolution in literature, as exemplified by F. Scott Fitzgerald's iconic The Great Gatsby. Illustrated books, in particular, were profoundly shaped by the Art Deco movement. Books from this period frequently featured eye-catching covers and illustrations, and innovative typography, with lavish details like oversized initial letters and elegant borders.


Ephemera: Art Deco's impact on the printing industry extended far beyond books. Its artistic and typographical trends are vividly captured in travel posters that featured aircraft, modern skyscrapers, ocean liners, and sleek trains. Stock certificates of the time often featured illustrations of manufacturing and transportation, reflecting the spirit of the machine age. Even sheet music from popular stage and screen productions was often emblazoned with striking cover art from the period.

Furniture: At the 1925 Paris Exposition, furniture was a central element. Visionary designers such as Le Corbusier championed minimalist pieces with bold geometric forms, a marked departure from the ornate furnishings of earlier generations. This period also gave rise to large-scale availability of factory-produced materials like wood laminates, lacquered finishes, and polished metals, bringing the elegance of Art Deco furniture to a mass audience.

Housewares: a plethora of companies sold consumers a vision of a future full of conical coffee cups, avant-garde light fixtures, and gleaming streamline toasters. No home was complete without these modern marvels. As industrialization expanded the availability of goods, manufacturers constantly introduced new offerings, pushing older designs out of vogue.

Technology: During the Jazz Age, entertainment was transformed by innovations like phonographs, radios, and cameras, all featuring Art Deco style. Radios often came in sleek Bakelite casings, while cameras, phonographs, and telephones held Art Deco accents. The glamorous style even extended to office machinery.



Words to live by in a convenient wood-like plaque

Some folks call them mottos. Or proverbs. Folk sayings. Adages. Often, they have a definite ring of truth. (After all, if you save a penny, then you do indeed have one more than you started with.) Proverb: The phrase is short, the meaning literal, and the truth or advice imparted is pretty obvious. ("Don't bite off more than you can chew.")

Idiom: A group of words which typically wouldn't make much sense together, but, thanks to continued usage, their meaning is understood. ("It's raining cats and dogs.")


Motto: A statement of belief or purpose

Just yesterday?







that may you serve you well, if you resolutely adhere to it. ("Never mix business with pleasure.")

Folk Saying: A sentence that gives advice or info based on human life experience. ("Charity begins at home.")


Axiom: An unprovable rule, accepted as true because it's self-evident. ("Nothing can both be and not be at the same time.")

Confusing? Well, "beggars can't be choosers," and the boundaries are blurry. What's important to remember is that each is an effective means of conveying an understood and accepted message, with a metaphorical or symbolic style that transcends everyday speech. By the




Above: Driven away for \$7,700, this 1986 pick-up had a lot of life left in it.







Keychains can open up a collector's heart

Sometimes, it's the little things that matter the most. And so it is with keychains, small objects kept in a pocket, jostled amongst a handful of change, only to be tossed onto the top of a bureau at the end of the day. Collecting them can be challenging, as antique examples are often misidentified, mistaken for buttons or tie clasps, pins or watch fobs.

Complicating the situation is the fact that keychains do not conform to any hard and fast description, as they can be found as rings alone, rings with fobs, or fobs alone. And then there's the matter of what to call them: "keyrings" or "keyfobs," or, as many collectors have agreed upon, "keychains."

"Even though they are fairly ubiquitous, keychains are not widely collected," according to Patrick Cottrell, a longtime collector. Living in the outskirts of Asheville, N.C., Cottrell said that many keychains have been lost to time simply because they were "used and not often preserved." In addition, he said, "Most of those who have an antique keychain collected it for the subject matter, not because it was a keychain." All the same, for those seeking a challenge, a keychain collection can be satisfying and rewarding.

Locks and keys date back thousands of years, when ancient Babylonians and Egyptians devised ways to safeguard their belongings. Instead of keeping their house keys on a cord (as did the Egyptians), the Romans kept their keys close at hand, attached to rings. Cottrell cautioned that while these Roman relics, unearthed by metal detectorists, can be found for sale for as little as \$20, he recommended caution when purchasing them, because they may or may not be reproductions.

Centuries later, in the 1800s, locks and keys became increasingly common due to the rise in industrialization. Beginning in the 1830s, the earliest keychains were mass produced. The first U.S. patent for a keyring was granted in 1869. And during the 1890s, keychains became a popular way to advertise businesses and products. By the 20th century, keychains were a part of everyday life.

Not surprisingly, this demand resulted in the making of a keychain to suit nearly every taste and interest. And for beginning collectors, this realization might prove to be a bit overwhelming. Sharing his own story, Cottrell said that his first keychain was one with a



Collectors like their barware shaken, not stirred

The jingle of ice as a bartender deftly shakes a cocktail in a bright container somehow enriches the experience. Today, we take cocktail shakers for granted; but before they were invented in the 19th century, drinks were either stirred with long-handled spoons or poured between two glasses. Enter the cocktail shaker; the multi-piece cocktail shaker as we know it didn't arrive until the mid-19th century, even though shaking drinks in some form has existed for millennia. The story goes that tavern keepers realized it was simpler to mix drinks by placing a larger tumbler over a smaller one — and shaking — rather than stirring or pouring between two glasses.

The emergence of the shaker coincided with an evolution of drinking habits, particularly in the United States. Cocktails were a departure from traditional European drinking customs, which primarily focused on wine, beer, and liqueurs. A major contributor to the

rise of cocktail culture was the increased availability of ice, first supplied by ice houses, and then made more accessible through refrigeration advancements. In the mid to late 1800s, both Americans and progressive Europeans enthusiastically embraced mixology, resulting in a vibrant array of drinks that were often best enjoyed shaken and chilled.

The cocktail movement was helped along by famous mixologists who published recipe books to support bartenders. Jerry Thomas wrote the first bartender's guide, "The Bon Vivant's Guide: How to Mix Drinks," in 1862. It was followed by Harry Johnson's "Bartenders Manual" published in Soon after, European bartenders, including Harry Craddock of the Savoy Hotel in London, penned similar publications like "The Savoy Cocktail Book," which featured an impressive 750 cocktail recipes. These books highlighted the importance of



holographic design of a dragon, a "neat" Christmas gift when he was six years old from his Dad. Over the years, Cottrell has refined his search, and for the past decade, has concentrated on adding examples of antique keychains to his collection. He estimates his current collection of keychains to number in the neighborhood of "10,000 or so."

But where to begin if you are not so gifted as a child? "Puzzles might be a good place to start," Cottrell suggested. An initial outlay of \$50 to \$100 can procure an interesting lot of vintage keychains. Or concentrate on the more than 100 game-inspired miniature reproductions produced by Basic Fun, some of which are playable. Think "Don't Break the Ice" and "Monopoly."

A Disney fan? Love all things Barbie? G.I. Joe? There's a keychain for that, or perhaps even a set of keychains. Sports fans might consider collecting keychains from "Lil Sports Brats," he continued, noting that, as with all collectibles, those with crossover appeal might sell for a bit more money. Other interesting possibilities include novelty keychains such as Sankyo's miniature music boxes,



which can be found for \$10 to \$30, and egg-shaped scenes with animated clockwork windings, issued in the 1990s by the toymaker Tocara.

Those up for a challenge might attempt to track down the keychains made by Tupperware; originally intended as premiums for sales associates, they were made to generate interest in all of the company's product lines. "That's a subset that's hard to get," Cottrell conceded.

Especially popular among Japanese collectors are keychains associated with "Sweet Orr," a manufacturer of what is now highly collectable vintage workers' clothing. Cottrell said that even reproduction keychains bearing the company's name are highly coveted, adding, "They are the only reproductions I've seen selling for more than \$100."



mid 20th century, such "words to live by" made their way into American homes, thanks to inspirational wall plaques. When folks found themselves in need of advice, encouragement, a smile, or just a pick-me-up on a dreary day, there it was, staring them right in the face.

Gazing at a wall plaque from the 1930s or '40s, you can't help but admire the hand-carved lettering and images, often highlighted with color accents, on burnished wood backings.

The Syracuse Ornamental Company of Syracuse, New York ("Syroco"), pioneered the concept of molded wood décor pieces, producing near-perfect replicas of hand carving. Although the plaques looked hand-carved, and of "real" wood, they actually weren't. Like other wood-like carved novelties of the era, these wall plaques were actually molded, pressed wood creations, putting them within the reach of almost every pocketbook. And, although numerous companies produced similar items, it was Syroco that developed the concept, and led the pack.

Syrocowood was a product born of necessity. In 1890, wood artisan Adolph Holstein, a recent immigrant to the United States, found his skills as an


accomplished carver in great demand. Ornately carved woodwork was popular, and Holstein's numerous commissions extended throughout New York. Soon, more master carvers were added to the staff of Holstein's new company, "Syroco," but the time-consuming process of handcarving limited the number of orders that could be accepted. Training additional carvers required years of apprenticeship. Holstein's solution was to create a master carving, cast a mold, then cast replicas from that. Since only one master carving was required for each design, both production and affordability were greatly enhanced.

Syroco's oft-stated goal was to ensure its Syrocowood objects were as close to "wood-like" as possible. The effect of authentic wood was enhanced by carving each master from the specific type of wood its replicas were intended to resemble. A lead mold was cast from the carving, with the surface textured as per the grain of the original wood. The mold was then filled with a mixture of wood flour, waxes, and resins, and compressed. After removal from the mold, sanding removed mold lines, and the piece received either multi-color decoration, or a natural wood stain.

In the company's early years, the call was primarily for decorative furniture trim, a ready replacement for hand-carving, or for expensive, less-detailed, stamped designs. Syroco trim pieces soon adorned everything from caskets to armchairs, and took the place of hand-carved trim molding in home interiors.


But tastes change. As highly ornamented furniture and molding trim fell out of favor, Syroco sought new avenues for its product. In the 1930s, the Syroco line of wood-like novelty items made its debut. Here, the creative impulses of Syroco carvers, and company designer Fred Fisher, could be given free reign on a dizzying array of ashtrays, door stops, dresser boxes, pen sets, picture frames, bookends, brush holders, corkscrews, bottle openers, clocks, paperweights, coasters, coin trays, desk calendars, bar trays, humidors, pipe racks, napkin rings, note boxes, thermometers, tie racks, statuettes. . and motto plaques.

These were the sort of items vacationers might snap up, and that was



that feature a watch. Cottrell reminded that keychains were a popular fad in France during the 1960s; Francophiles might seek those keychains produced by the Bourbon Company, often with a clip in the shape of a rounded horseshoe. Also notable is the "Return to Tiffany" keychain, introduced in the 1960s.

But in Cottrell's opinion, the "Holy Grail" for collectors "at the moment" would be those made to commemorate the World's Columbian Exposition, held in Chicago in 1893; these silver keychains are considered to be the first ones intended as souvenirs. On the other hand, a collection of keychains associated with a favorite vacation destination might be a fun category to pursue. And don't overlook the idea of making your own keychain, as Cottreel has done using a fishing lure found on a beach.

On the topic of condition, Cottrell said that flaws do not automatically negate a purchase. Because keychains were intended to be used, they often


show signs of wear. He said that collectors need to weigh any less-thanperfect condition against the possibility of never finding a similar keychain that is more perfect.

As for how to best store a collection, Cottrell said that many enthusiasts display their favorites on a pegboard. He favors using a flat file cabinet, which allows him to view and appreciate his holdings. On the creative side, he has also repurposed an old spool holder to display some of his keychains. His earliest method, he said, a binder ring, has long since been proven to be inadequate. Meanwhile, he is reluctant to use his rarest examples for their original intended purpose.

For those wishing to learn more and to connect with other collectors, Cottrell recommends joining Keychains Collectors International. Once an in-person club that met every other year for in-person conventions, the group has transitioned into an active Facebook club, with approximately 3,000 members from around the world. Trading information and swapping with like-minded collectors is among the benefits members enjoy. You can find it here: www.facebook.com/groups/Keychainrecruiter

In the end, it's the thrill of the chase that motivates collectors like Cottrell. "The fun thing is that you never know what's out there."

quality bar tools, including those for shaking cocktails.

The first shakers were simply two metal cups designed to fit together. They were typically made of tin, although more upscale establishments sometimes used copper or silver tumblers. The earliest U.S. patent for a cocktail shaking tool was issued in 1872, for a device that could mix six drinks at once. During the 19th century, numerous patents brought forth an array of creative adaptations to the basic shaker, including one version with a built-in juicer. From that array came three iconic shaker types that have stood the test of time: the Boston. Cobbler, and French shakers.

The Boston shaker, which remains a favorite among professionals, was one of the original cocktail shaker varieties. Although its exact origins are not well-documented, it is believed to have been developed by a bartender in Boston during the mid-19th century. This two-piece shaker consists of a larger mixing tin paired with a smaller tin or glass that fits snugly against its opening.

The cobbler shaker also referred to as a Manhattan shaker, was patented by Edward Hauck in 1884 and has become the most popular choice for home use. This all-in-one shaker features a metal tin, a lid with a built-in strainer, and a cap that often doubles as a measuring tool. The name "cobbler" may have originated from the Sherry Cobbler, a well-known 19th-century cocktail that required shaking and straining.



Old Florida souvenirs offersun-kissedmemories

Ever since Henry Flagler laid railroad tracks and built hotels along Florida's east coast, the southernmost state has captured the hearts of travelers. The influx of tourists fueled a thriving industry of Florida keepsakes. Travelers delighted in purchasing souvenirs from roadside attractions — like alligator farms, quirky gift shops, and roadside motels — each piece representing a fond memory of their journey. Today, collectors seek out vintage Florida souvenirs, captivated by their nostalgic ties to the state's golden age of travel.

Before Flagler's grand ambitions, Florida was regarded as a bug-infested swamp where only the hardiest would set foot. That changed with the opening in 1888 of Flagler's opulent Ponce de Leon Hotel, in St. Augustine, which put Florida on the map for wealthy travelers. That magnificent hotel was followed by others that sprung up in burgeoning cities like Miami and St. Petersburg. As they opened their doors, railroads and ships began bringing cruise enthusiastic travelers, creating the foundation for Florida's tourism industry.

After 1900, tourism in Florida thrived with the advent of the automobile and the expansion of roads, railways, and even early air travel made Florida destinations more accessible. Iconic attractions like the Bok Tower and Daytona Boardwalk opened to excited visitors in the 1920s. The 1930s saw even more tourist draws, including Cypress Gardens, with its famed waterskiing shows, Jungle Gardens, and Silver Springs. During this time, Miami Beach emerged as a premier destination, marked by the construction of luxurious Art Deco hotels, the opening of the famed Ocean Drive, and the influx of celebrities and socialites drawn to Miami's vibrant nightlife and beautiful sandy beaches.

As the automobile became more widespread in the mid-20th century, Florida experienced a boom in tourist attractions that catered to road-tripping families. Popular destinations including Gatorland and Weeki Wachee Springs, known for its mermaid shows, opened their doors in the 1940s. The first true theme park — Busch Gardens Tampa Bay — opened in 1959, followed by Kennedy Space Center in 1967. To accommodate the growing number of tourists, hundreds of motels and restaurants featuring exciting concepts began to line popular travel routes.

When Walt Disney World opened in 1971, it ushered in a new era for the state's tourism industry. The park quickly attracted a surge of visitors that bolstered the economies of local towns and spawned the development of nearby resorts and entertainment options including other parks like SeaWorld in 1973.


All those roadside attractions, theme parks, glorious beaches, and natural wonders proved irresistible, making the Sunshine State the preferred destination for many families. For decades, the familiar refrain of "Are we there yet?" echoed from back seats, embodying the anticipation of a Florida adventure.

Souvenirs offered visitors a tangible way to capture those adventures. Tourists were delighted by quirky items like rubber alligators that highlighted the state's unique wildlife, kitschy seashell crafts, and postcards that captured images of their destinations. These keepsakes offered families a way to bring home a piece of their holiday and conjure memories long after their trip ended.

Today, collectors are captivated by vintage Florida souvenirs because of their charm and the nostalgic connection to Florida's halcyon years. In our current era dominated by technology, artifacts like old roadside attraction brochures, motel memorabilia — and even those rubber alligators — are tangible connections to a simpler time.

The French or Parisian shaker resembles a cobbler shaker but consists of just two pieces and lacks a built-in strainer. This design means bartenders must either use a separate strainer or carefully pour through a small gap between the two sections.

In addition to these classic styles, pour-type shakers gained popularity between the two world wars, often resembling modified teapots. Some were made entirely of metal, while others featured glass bottoms with metal lids. Some were made entirely of metal, while others featured glass bottoms with metal lids. A defining characteristic of these shakers is a small spout on one side. They are commonly referred to as "martini shakers" today.

In Victorian England, cocktail shakers became a symbol of sophistication. Their designs also frequently mimicked silver teapots, which suited the shift from tea time to cocktail hour. Notable retailers like Tiffany and Harrods capitalized on this trend by including silver-plated shakers in their offerings.

At the outset of the 20th century, silver and other metals still held sway, but stainless steel, developed in the 1920s, emerged as the preferred material for cocktail shakers, favored by bartenders on both sides of the Atlantic for its durability, rust resistance, and ease of cleanup.

The 1920s saw the emergence of fresh cocktail shaker designs, shaped by the fashionable Art Nouveau and Art

Deco styles. The International Exposition of Decorative Arts and Modern Industries in 1925 introduced a machine-age aesthetic, and shakers began featuring forms that reflected progress and industrial innovation. Chrome and Bakelite became popular materials. Designers like Russel Wright and firms such as Revere created shakers inspired by everything from skyscrapers to zeppelins. German-made shakers from this period were particularly esteemed for their high-quality craftsmanship.

Prohibition in the United States had a profound impact on cocktail shaker design. With bars closed, the only legal option for drinking was at home. Nevertheless. companies Farberware and Chase Brass & Copper continued to manufacture cocktail shakers. Yet, because cocktail paraphernalia was under scrutiny, these shakers were made overly ornate or crafted in shapes that otherwise disguised their true identity. During this time, figural shakers became particularly popular, featuring whimsical designs like penguins and lighthouses.

The years between the repeal of Prohibition and the onset of World War II saw a revival of cocktail culture, with people enjoying drinks in bars and at home. Cocktail parties became trendy, making display-worthy barware as desirable as quality liquor. However,



actually the original intent. Billed as "just right for elegant living and gracious giving," pressed wood plaques made great souvenirs. On many, there was a molded circular space, for a decal heralding the specific vacation spot where it had been purchased. Across the United States, dime and department stores began stocking the plaques.

The popularity of Syroco soon gave rise to a host of imitators: main competitor Burwood Products Co. ("Karv-Kraft") of Michigan; the Canadian firm, Durwood; Multi-Products ("Décor-A-Wood); Ornamental Arts & Crafts Co. ("Orn-A-Craft); and even a Syroco associate company, Ornawood.

The 1950s also saw a major shift in what exactly constituted a Syroco product, with compression molding phased out in favor of injection molding. Although the appearance was still of hand-carved wood, the composition was now an all-polymer blend. Resulting pieces were lighter, sturdier and cheaper.

Today, vintage Syrocowood plaques



The site of the U.S. national capital had been considered in several cities before settling in Washington, D.C. Initially, Philadelphia served as the temporary capital after the Declaration of Independence, and New York City briefly became the capital in the late 1780s. Other cities like Princeton, Trenton, Annapolis, and Baltimore also hosted the Continental Congress during and after the Revolutionary War. In 1790, a decision was made to build a permanent capital along the Potomac River, and construction began on Washington, D.C., which officially became the capital in 1800.



Since 2002, the Strong Museum of Play, located in Rochester, New York, has been the home of the Toy Hall of Fame, having taken over the honors from the A. C. Gilbert's Discovery Village in Salem, Oregon. Every year, toys are nominated for entrance based on several criteria. Nominated but not chosen were "Choose Your Own Adventure" books, balloons, and, despite an annual strong lobbying effort, Hess Toy Trucks.



Mosser Uranium Glass

If you do not already have one in your car console or back pocket, be sure to include a small black light to your "must have" items on hand when antiquing. Nothing impresses more than shining that little light on an otherwise blah looking piece of dull green or yellow glassware and watching it glow to life – that is, if it is made of uranium aka Vaseline glass. Popular in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, uranium glass glows a gorgeous green or yellow color when exposed to UV light. Mosser Glass of Cambridge, Ohio, is one company who used uranium glass to create a variety of products in the 1950s. Pieces created by Mosser using uranium glass include figurines, like their Trojan Horse, entire glassware sets that include tumblers and a matching pitcher, and their most impressive piece; pedestal cake stands that come in a variety of sizes and designs.

Easter Bunny Origins

The Easter Bunny likely originated from the "Osterhase," an egg-laying hare in German folklore. The character was brought to America by the Pennsylvania Dutch in the 18th century.

Long Stitch Needlepoint

Cross-stitch, embroidery, crewel - collecting either vintage kits or completed works of these types of crafts is always popular and prices can reflect this. An often overlooked "red-headed cousin" of this genre that is being over-looked no more is the craft of long stitch needlepoint. Where cross-stitch and embroidery requires one be deft of needle and have great eyesight, long stitch is more forgiving. Often thought to be the craft that required "less talent" these vintage kits or completed works are finally having their day. Popular in the late 1960s and into the 1970s, snagging a long stitch piece is now considered a prize! Companies who produced these kits include Sunset, Candamar, Dimensions, and Horizons to name a few.

Lucite Trivets

Trivets – those decorative metalwork pieces made of cast iron, pot metal or brass held aloft via small feet used to protect a counter from a dish hot from the oven; they are collecting genre in their own right, but the "hot" trivet today are those made of Lucite! In 1937, The Dupont Company, formally known as E.I. du Pont de Nemours & Company, released their own version of Plexiglass or acrylic in the US and called it Lucite. By the 1960s and 70s, Lucite became a household staple with kitchen "hot plates" or trivets being quite popular. These discs of Lucite encased any and everything resulting in a decorative kitchen accent statement when not in use. Dried flowers and ferns are popular. Glittery rocks or abalone sea shells are showy, and those with insects - think butterflies; are must haves for those who collect these vintage kitchen staples.



Advertising thermometers are still "hot"




Long before the weather app on your phone would instantly tell you the temperature, the thermometer on the side of the barn or the home or at the local grocery store filled the role. Because everyone seemed to want to look at the temperature, it became natural for companies to begin to use the thermometer as an advertising tool.

Companies like Coca-Cola learned that if an advertisement were also a utilitarian object, such as a clock or a thermometer, it would stay up at the





this period also coincided with the Great Depression, prompting manufacturers to mass-produce cocktail shakers from more affordable materials, especially glass. Companies like Cambridge, Fostoria, and Heisey responded by offering a variety of creative yet budget-friendly glass shakers.

America's involvement in World War II halted the production of cocktail shakers, as metals and other materials used in barware manufacturing were redirected to the war effort. In the post-war era, the cocktail shaker surged back into fashion, with designs influenced by the new materials and bold creativity of the atomic age. During this time, many homes sported rec rooms or patios with bars, creating new spaces for socializing. Additionally, television and popular repopularized cocktail culture, a trend famously underscored by James Bond's iconic martini request. "Shaken, not stirred."

Meanwhile, a shift was underway that would soon reshape the cocktail scene. The rise of electric blenders and mixers made the art of shaking cocktails feel outdated. Tastes also evolved, and intricate cocktails gave way to simpler mixed drinks like highballs and Manhattans, which only needed a swift stir to prepare. By the 1970s, shaken drinks had largely fallen out of favor, making way for "boat drinks" such as piña coladas and frozen daiquiris, which needed a blender for preparation.

The 1990s ushered in a nostalgic revival of cocktail culture, largely driven by relaxed legal restrictions that enabled craft distillers to bring back traditional distilling methods. With that, bartenders returned to finely crafted cocktails and again embraced the art of using a quality cocktail shaker.

That rich history of cocktail shakers creates ample opportunities for collectors. Although there are over a century's worth of shakers on the market, generally, the most sought-after pieces come from the period between the World Wars, and those from the vibrant cocktail revival of the 1950s.


If you are looking for a trophy, particularly from the Art Deco era, some of the top designers include Louis W. Rice (1872-1933), most known for "skyscraper" cocktail shakers in the late 1920s. Good examples of those can run upwards of \$2,000. Napier Company made the highly sought-after (and much reproduced) penguin shaker. An original 1920s version can run over \$1,000. Modern replicas, from companies like Restoration Hardware can be found for under \$50. J.A. Henckels was the company responsible for the famed Streamline Moderne zeppelin shakers introduced in 1928. An original can set you back several thousand dollars, while a newer vintage replica might fetch under \$200.

Mass-produced shakers from the 1920s to the 1990s are more accessible to most collectors. Made by brands like Farberware, Revere, and glass companies like Heisey, these shakers usually range in price from \$20 to \$200, depending on condition, age, and design. A crucial tip for new collectors is to avoid buying a cobbler or pour-type shaker without its cap; while it may look nice as a display piece, it won't be functional.


For those who collect them, vintage cocktail shakers offer a glimpse into the evolution of drinking culture and the innovations that have influenced how we prepare cocktails. From the early days of mixing in simple metal cups to the intricate designs of the 20th century, each shaker tells a unique story. That legacy provides a range of choices to accommodate every collector's taste and budget.





magnets with Florida themes were always popular collectibles that allowed tourists to take home a piece of their travel experience. Favored among collectors are souvenirs that represent establishments lost to time.

Transportation Memorabilia: Collectibles related to airlines, cruise ships, and railways that served Florida reflect the evolution of travel in the state. Popular items include promotional brochures, luggage tags, tickets, and timetables.

The cost of vintage Florida souvenirs varies widely, reflecting the broad array of available merchandise. For instance, common finds like keychains or postcards featuring Florida attractions can be acquired for as little as \$1 to \$3. In contrast, more unique items, like authentic restaurant ware will typically range from \$25 to \$75, depending on the rarity and condition. Serious collectors might pay \$200 or more for hand-made Miccosukee or Seminole tribe collectibles or limited-edition art prints from famous Florida attractions. The diversity allows collectors to pursue unique avenues and engage at their own pace and budget.

Collecting old Florida souvenirs is a charming pursuit that intertwines nostalgia, history, and personal connection. These collectibles help preserve the legacy of forgotten landmarks and help capture the evolution of today's favorite attractions.

store longer than an ordinary sign. Advertising thermometers were a popular form of advertising for everything from bakeries to liquor stores to meat markets, and from food, automobile, healthcare and photography industries to World's Fair expositions.

The first such mercury-filled thermometers were attached to wood, but in time metal thermometers took over. Common shapes for vintage advertising thermometers were round signs with hands like a clock, and vertical, rectangular or die-cut signs with a mercury meter in the middle. Often the signs were cut into an elongated shape, or a soda bottle.

These thermometers varied in size, with some as small as 9 to 12 inches in diameter, while other rectangular versions were as big as 6 feet tall. The most common height for rectangular thermometers is 16 to 17 inches.


From 1946 to the early 1970s, many of these thermometers were made by the Pam Clock Company, which produced advertising thermometers and clocks for large firms, and epitomized the industry.

Advertising thermometers are generally a cross-over collectible with people adding a thermometer to their collection based on what the thermometer advertised. But there are also people who collect the thermometers in their own right.

Coca-Cola is always a popular collecting category and thermometers are no different. Coca-Cola began making and distributing thermometers in the 1920s. Most retailers displayed them




outside, so the early thermometers were often made of metal, which were tinned for durability. Often these Coca-Cola thermometers were embossed so the bottle design "bulged" out from the surroundings on the thermometer.

As the years went by, the look of Coca-Cola thermometers evolved to stay in step with trends in popular culture. For example, many Coca-Cola thermometers from the 1940s featured an oval-shaped Art Deco design to match the interiors of drug stores and soda fountains of the day. Many of these were made out of Masonite and some were painted gold.

By the 1960s, many of these and other Cola-Cola thermometers made the transition to plastic. Regardless of the period or specific design, the Coca-Cola always incorporated its recognizable red-and-white color scheme and featured slogans, such as "Thirst knows no season," "Delicious and Refreshing," and of course, "Things Go Getter with Coke."

After the 1980s, advertising thermometers dwindled in popularity as detecting temperatures through digital technologies increased in popularity.





Chalk it up!




